CRAFTS COORDINATOR JOB DESCRIPTION FOR CAMP LAKEVIEW

Required Qualifications

- 1. Minimum age 18 years old and one year removed from high school.
- 2. Training and experience in a variety of arts and crafts and the ability to teach these skills to others.
- 3. Desire and ability to work with children outdoors.
- 4. As a representative of Lakeview Ministries, agrees to demonstrate a lifestyle and teach Christian doctrine in accordance with the beliefs of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Desired Qualifications

- 1. Member in good standing of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.
- 2. Possess the ability to lead others in group crafts activities, demonstrating necessary steps and skills.
- 3. Willingness to experience outdoor living and to teach/learn new skills.
- 4. Ability to accept supervision and guidance, and to work well with others.
- 5. Possess imagination, a sense of humor, patience, conviction, sincerity, enthusiasm, initiative, self-control, adaptability, willingness to learn, integrity, ingenuity, a sense of spiritual direction, and the presence of God in his/her life.

To Whom Responsible

- 1. The Executive Director, Director of Operations, and Program Director in terms of application and employment, training and work assignments, as well as personnel policies and practices.
- 2. The Asst. Program Director in all areas relative to program activities, inter-staff responsibilities, and regular or special work duties.

General Responsibilities

- 1. Responsible for planning, preparing, leading, and coordinating all arts and crafts projects for the various age levels of campers.
- 2. A total commitment for the term of employment.
- 3. Understand, interpret, and maintain the camp's standards and policies.
- 4. Possess an attitude and actions which continually reflect that Christ lives within you and that you view your position as an opportunity to be in His service.

Specific Responsibilities

- 1. Before camp starts, plan projects and assist the Program Director in ordering supplies.
- 2. Set up the crafts room during staff training.
- 3. Teach staff their responsibilities in activities during staff training.
- 4. Teach all arts & crafts sessions for campers, adequately preparing in advance so you can start on time, and ensuring the proper use of equipment.
- 5. Lead and guide summer staff during their time in the craft room.
- 6. As the summer progresses, recommend additional purchase of materials and supplies to the Program Director, keeping the budget in mind.
- 7. Supervise, mentor, and guide the Junior Crafts person throughout the summer.
- 8. Conduct initial and end-of-summer inventory of supplies and equipment.
- 9. Continually check equipment and be responsible for necessary repairs.
- 10. Keep the arts and crafts area and porch clean, orderly, and safe.
- 11. Clean and store all equipment after its final use of the day.
- 12. Be in constant search for new, creative projects.

- 13. After breakfast during the general camp clean-up time and Bible study, help the wranglers gather and saddle all the horses needed for the day OR conduct the cabin cleanliness check.
- 14. On occasion lead Bible study and camper devotions.
- 15. Record and file a compilation of possible projects for future use.
- 16. As a team member, assist other staff in any task that will enhance the outdoor ministry of Lakeview Ministries. This includes participating in evening activities such as TBAs and campfire devotions.
