MEDIA SPECIALIST JOB DESCRIPTION FOR CAMP LAKEVIEW

Required Qualifications

- 1. Minimum age 18 years old and one year removed from high school.
- 2. Training and experience in photography, videography, and editing.
- 3. Desire and ability to work in a camp setting.
- 4. As a representative of Lakeview Ministries, agrees to demonstrate a lifestyle and teach Christian doctrine in accordance with the beliefs of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Desired Qualifications

- 1. Member in good standing of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.
- 2. Possess the ability to capture high quality photographs and videos, and to create promotional and social media materials for camp.
- 3. Willingness to experience outdoor living and to learn new skills.
- 4. Ability to drive an all-terrain vehicle around camp property.
- 5. Ability to accept supervision and guidance, and to work well with others.
- 6. Possess imagination, a sense of humor, patience, conviction, sincerity, enthusiasm, initiative, self-control, adaptability, willingness to learn, integrity, ingenuity, a sense of spiritual direction, and the presence of God in his/her life.

To Whom Responsible

- 1. The Executive Director, Director of Operations, and Program Director in terms of application and employment, training and work assignments, as well as personnel policies and practices.
- 2. The Assistant Program Director in all areas relative to program activities, inter-staff responsibilities, and regular or special work duties.

General Responsibilities

- 1. Responsible for taking photographs and videos of campers at a variety of daily activities, and editing these materials.
- 2. A total commitment for the term of employment.
- 3. Understand, interpret, and maintain the camp's standards and policies.
- 4. Possess an attitude and actions which continually reflect that Christ lives within you and that you view your position as an opportunity to be in His service.

Specific Responsibilities

- 1. Move all old media files into a storage drive, and create new media files during staff training.
- 2. Communicate with counselors weekly to coordinate time for taking cabin pictures.
- 3. Coordinate and lead the All-Camp Picture.
- 4. Photograph daily summer camp activities for Waldo, Staff Memory DVD, and promotional material for Lakeview Ministries, totaling 150+ uploaded photos per day minimum.
- 5. Videotape summer activities for weekly Recap Video and for promotional material for Lakeview Ministries, totaling at least 1 hour of footage per week.
- 6. Create weekly Recap Video, to be distributed every Monday morning.
- 7. Organize photographs into various categories (Brochure, Dinner Auction, DVDs, etc) for ease of use.
- 8. Post pictures daily to Waldo, with approval of full-time staff.
- 9. Create social media content to promote the summer camp program, on a daily basis, with approval of full-time staff.

- 10. Conduct video interviews with campers, junior staff, and summer staff to be used for future promotion.
- 11. As the summer progresses, recommend additional purchase of equipment and software to supervisors, keeping the budget in mind.
- 12. Sort through and delete any extra or unusable (blurry, inappropriate, etc.) photos and videos.
- 13. Continually check equipment and be responsible for necessary repairs.
- 14. Clean and store all equipment after its final use of the day.
- 15. Be in constant search for new, creative ideas.
- 16. Record and file a compilation of possible ideas and recommendations for future use by staff.
- 17. Create an end of summer staff photo slideshow and video.
- 18. Fill in for staff who need to take time away from their normal program duties.
- 19. On occasion lead Bible study and camper devotions.
- 20. As a team member, assist other staff in any task that will enhance the outdoor ministry of Lakeview Ministries. This includes participating in evening activities such as TBAs and campfire devotions.
