WRANGLER JOB DESCRIPTION FOR CAMP LAKEVIEW

Required Qualifications

- 1. Minimum age 18 years old and one year removed from high school.
- 2. Training and experience in the care, feeding, habits, and use of horses.
- 3. Ability to teach campers the care and proper riding procedures of horses.
- 4. As a representative of Lakeview Ministries, agrees to demonstrate a lifestyle and teach Christian doctrine in accordance with the beliefs of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Desired Qualifications

- 1. Member in good standing of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.
- 2. Ability to accept guidance and supervision from others and to work with others.
- 3. Organized and self-motivated, with the initiative to find work that needs to be done without being told.
- 4. Possess current certifications in American Red Cross First-Aid and CPR.
- 5. Possess imagination, a sense of humor, patience, conviction, sincerity, enthusiasm, initiative, self-control, adaptability, willingness to learn, integrity, ingenuity, a sense of spiritual direction, and the presence of God in his/her life.

To Whom Responsible

- 1. The Executive Director, Director of Operations, and Program Director in terms of application and employment, training and work assignments, as well as personnel policies and practices.
- 2. The Assistant Program Director in all areas relative to program activities, inter-staff responsibilities, and regular or special work duties.

General Responsibilities

- 1. To plan, supervise, and administer Camp Lakeview's horseback riding program.
- 2. Possess an attitude and actions which continually reflect that Christ lives within you and that you view your position as an opportunity to be in His service.

Specific Responsibilities

- 1. Instruct campers in the proper riding techniques, teaching them to follow normal safety guidelines.
- 2. Teach campers how to care for their horse, and let them assist with daily watering, brushing, grooming, etc...
- 3. Instruct and lead summer staff in proper horse walking technique and safe behavior around horses.
- 4. Lead all trail rides with assistance from an assigned counselor and Junior Counselors.
- 5. Care for the dietary and physical needs of the horses, calling in professional help when necessary.
- 6. Maintain weekly communication with horse owner from whom we rent the horses to make them aware of and seek advice about any concerns regarding health or behavior of horses.
- 7. Supervise, mentor, and guide the Junior Wranglers.
- 8. Keep track of stock of horse supplies and bring requests for orders to the attention of a full-time staff member.
- 9. Make recommendations to the Program Director for equipment purchases.
- 10. Repair or recommend replacement of any damaged equestrian equipment.

- 11. Responsibility for the cleaning of the shelterhouse and its bathrooms and storage room on the closing day of each session.
- 12. On occasion lead Bible study and camper devotions.
- 13. Attend required staff meetings.
- 14. Evaluate current operations and make recommendations as they arise.
- 15. On occasion lead Bible study and camper devotions.
- 16. Meet with the Program Director on a weekly basis to share concerns or recommendations.
- 17. As a team member, assist other staff in any task that will enhance the outdoor ministry of Lakeview Ministries. This includes participating in evening activities such as TBAs and campfire devotions.
