
The relationships I made here have lasted me a lifetime. I have never met/worked with better people.

SUMMER GAMP REGAP

Every summer, Lakeview Ministries has the opportunity to touch hundreds of lives with the life-changing message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We're delighted to share the good news that this opportunity continues to grow.

This year alone, 2,438 people graced us with their presence through our summer programming. That's a growth of 152 over last year and 479 more people that we saw in 2021. We also added a Villages session and saw a 20% increase in participation in our Family Days programming.

While we're excited about the growth, it's not the numbers that thrill us. It's the fact that more and more people are seeking what Lakeview Ministries is offering: a chance to experience all the love and community that the body of Christ brings.

To us, camp is bigger than the numbers. It's the sum total of all the times our campers learned something new about themselves, about God, and about each other. If even just one camper came to camp and encountered Jesus, it would be worth it! The fact that over 2,000 did so humbles us beyond words!
