# REGISTRATION: A LOOK BACK

The launch of registration has always been an exciting time as campers sign up for the summer and dream of warmer days. We thought it'd be fun to look back at some of our memories about the process and all the ways it has changed over the years.

## THE EARLY YEARS

Before our Pathways of Promise campaign in 1997, registrations would trickle in through the winter season with little stress and even less urgency. But between 1997 and 2004, registrations tripled in size, growing from 600 to 1500 campers during that timeframe. This rapid growth led to massive wait lists, with 20-30 kids per session hoping for a single spot.

## FEBRUARY 1ST DATE INTRODUCED

This increase in campers meant we needed to develop new procedures to keep registration fair for everyone, with equal opportunity to get into a session. So we made a rule in 2007 that all registrations postmarked on February 1st would receive equal priority in the initial session sorting. Send your registration in too early? You'd be bumped back. Send it in too late? Same deal. During these years, families hit the road on February 1st to hand-deliver their registrations for fear they would get lost in the mail.

## **ONLINE REGISTRATION**

In 2016, we made the switch from paper registrations to an online system. While this switch was necessary and brought a lot of needed upgrades to our registration process, it also led to all sorts of "fun" technological hiccups to navigate. The most memorable was probably in 2021 when so many families logged on to the


registration system that it crashed completely, not just for Lakeview, but for every single camp across the nation that uses CampWise to register. We had to cancel the registration opening and try again the next day.

## **PRE-REGISTRATION**

The stress of a first-come, first-serve process are what led to our latest change in the registration process, switching to the Pre-Registration process we instituted last year and are continuing today. In a lot of ways, this Pre-Registration process is basically the online version of the paper postmark system we established back in 2007, where everyone who pre-registers has an equal chance of being sorted into a session that works for them.

When it comes to our registration process, whatever comes next, we're always so grateful for the graciousness shown to us by our camp families as they navigate registration with us. Here's to the next 60 years of successful registration launches!





For the first time ever, Camp Lakeview required its users to wait for a certain date before registering for summer camp. This new policy gave everyone an equal opportunity to receive the registration materials through the mail or through church or school, coordinate dates with friends, fill out the form, and put it in the mail on February 1<sup>st</sup>. This was the camp's best solution to the problems faced last year, when one week of camp was filled before the brochures were even mailed, and when some people who mailed in their registration the day after they received it found that everything

was filled.

## THE YEAR WE CRASHED THE INTERNET

On February 1, 2021, when we caused a system wide crash of the registration software, this was the notice sent by CampWise to all the camps affected by the outage:

"Today, there was one Campwise customer who has a large volume of registrations on opening day. The high level of volume combined with the way we implemented the enhancement created a lock issue within the database server. When the database server experiences such an issue all Campwise usage is affected. For that reason, we made the difficult decision to take online registration down while we corrected the issue."







The start of registration got off to an awesome start this year. Here are how things are looking as we head into March!

- 1597 Number of campers who signed up during Pre-Registration
- 100% Percentage of campers we were able to sort into a session
- 4 Number of sessions that filled completely during Pre-Registration
- 503 Remaining spots left for the summer

# MAKÍNG GAMPAWAILABI

An experience at camp has the power to change a life. That's something we firmly believe, and it leads to something else we're passionate about - that camp should be available for all kids and families, regardless of their financial circumstances.

Looking ahead to this year, we anticipate an increased number of people needing help paying for camp. Costs are rising, and paychecks aren't necessarily keeping pace. We've also had to raise our camp fees as costs have increased for us, too. So we thought it would be a great time to talk through all the different ways we strive—with the help of gracious supporters—to make camp a place that anyone can afford to attend.

## **TIERED PRICING: A STARTING POINT**

Tiered pricing gives families the ability to choose between three different pricing levels when paying for camp. Tier A most closely matches the true cost of camp, while Tiers B and C are subsidized by donors to cover costs. There is no difference in the camp experience regardless of the tier you choose for your camper. When families voluntarily choose to pay the more expensive Tier A or B prices, it helps stretch our donations further to help other families in need. Since we introduced tiered pricing, over 50% of our families have chosen to pay the higher prices, which truly speaks to the heart of the Lakeview family and its desire to see as many kids as possible come to camp each summer

## **CAMPERSHIPS**

Camperships are scholarships awarded to help pay for the cost of camp. The Lakeview Foundation generously provides a set amount each year for camperships, using money from funds set up for the purpose. One is the Schneider fund, created in honor of Jim Schneider, a long-time supporter of camp. Another is the Rummele fund, created to honor the memory of Arthur Rummele, a Lakeview camper who passed away. The final fund is the Tom (Digger) Franke Campership Fund, created in honor of Digger for his many years serving at camp.

In addition to the funds provided through the Lakeview Foundation, many people donate each year to assist with our campership fund. This is very helpful in ensuring we don't run short when awarding camperships to people requesting help. Last year alone, we awarded \$16,750 in campership money to 67 different campers over the course of the summer!

## **DONATIONS**

In addition to campership-focused donations, regular donations also help a ton in making camp affordable! ANY donation helps cover the gap between the true cost of camp and what we collect through registration fees. The more robust our donor support, the more flexibility we have in reducing fees for camp. We are so grateful for our Lakeview Partners (those who give \$100+ in a year) and the blessing they provide to so many campers by allowing us to charge less than the true cost of camp while still keeping the lights on!

Do You Want To Help?

This year the true cost for a single camper to attend a week of camp is \$675. If you'd like to help provide the life-changing experience of camp to all children, simply follow the steps below:
