

GENERATIONS UNITED BY CAMP TRADITION



Although much has changed at camp over the past 60 years, one thing has remained constant: the deep love for this special place shared by generations of families. The following stories beautifully illustrate this legacy, from the camp's early beginnings to the present day.

LAYING THE FOUNDATION: MARSHALL KIEL'S STORY

When Camp Lakeview was first built, Marshall Kiel's family played a pivotal role in introducing potential supporters to the property. "My dad used his work truck," Marshall said, "and we filled the back with folding chairs so people could tour the property and catch a vision for what a Lutheran camp could become."

Marshall's father, Carl, was instrumental in securing the land for the camp. "My dad was a fuel oil jobber," he said. "One of his customers owned the 120 acres where Camp Lakeview now sits. He said to my dad, 'I heard you guys are wanting to start a camp. Why don't you buy my ground?"

Since those early days, Marshall and his extended family have remained deeply involved in Lakeview's mission. "There's a unique

dynamic when you draw people away from their homes and into an outdoor setting, allowing both children and adults to havetheir spiritual eyes opened," he said.

Thanks to the vision and faith of Marshall's family and others, Camp Lakeview became a reality, and its impact has only grown.
